Information for parents and carers:

Family visits are provided by Jigsaw throughout the year.

Family visits for school age children take place on Friday mornings during school holidays.

Parent and tots visits take place on other Friday mornings through the year.

Family visits provide the prisoner with the chance to engage in play activities with their child(ren). They are able to move freely around the visit hall.

Grandads and uncles are also welcome to apply for family visits.

To apply for any of these visits:

Encourage your dad or loved one to fill in an application which can be found at the PID (Prisoner Information Desk).

When coming to visit your family member you may need to travel for a short or long time.


You might travel in a car, on a train, a bus, or walk. Circle the picture showing how you got here today!



I wonder how many different colour cars you saw on your journey? If you are lucky you might even see some animals in the fields.




When your family member is not at home it can make you feel lots of different emotions.




It is normal to feel sad or angry when a loved one has gone away.

Inside the main building you will see lots of people dressed in black and white

The people in black and white might have a radio





You will line up in a queue with lots of other people.

When you leave you might feel happy that you saw each other and maybe a bit sad that you are leaving. It's okay to have lots of different feelings.





When you are on your visit you might:



Have some food and drink.

Play with some toys.



Tell them about what you have been doing this week. Maybe tell them about school. Sometimes you might see a dog. These special dogs like to sniff people.



One of the people in black and white will ask you to stand in a square marked on the floor. They will ask you to put your arms out like an aeroplane.



They will give you a pat down, which might tickle and make you laugh.






When it is time to go into the visit room, you will go through a big door and some gates.
